The Oklahoma Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP) provides a \$50 EBT debit card to eligible seniors. This card can only be used to purchase locally grown produce, raw honey, and fresh-cut herbs.

I am still trying to remember what I said that led to the misunderstanding about how I was dressed when I fled the mountain in my car, fully dressed, not in a nightgown, as reported.

At that point, I quickly dressed, removed my car from the garage and was trying to pack a bag when the evacuation order came. Thus I evacuated with little more than the set of clothes I was wearing.
